Dear Parents and Carers,




Ofsted's very successful inspection visit in

Punctuality and persistent absence or lateness is monitored by Trafford's Educational Welfare Officer, and failure to improve may result in a fixed penalty notice being issued.



Please help your child be ready to learn, by providing them with a single zipped pencil case containing a blue handwriting pen (not a cartridge, ball point or biro), plus a spare one, an HB pencil, a short ruler, and a **small** selection of pencil crayons. Uniform must be labelled with your child's name please. Sensible black school shoes must be worn, **not** trainer-style

footwear.

A huge thank you to parents who have already paid a contribution to school fund, which enables the school to continue to provide enrichment activities, such as visits by theatre groups and authors, extra equipment and resources, which would not other-wise be possible for the children to enjoy.
