Science

'Electromagnetic Radiation' sounds pretty cool, right? Electromagnetic waves form a spectrum of different wavelengths; this spectrum includes visible light, X-rays and radio waves. 6. What historic land is the church built on?
7. Who built the new church in 1714?
8. What was added to the church in 1874?
9. What is the oldest grave dated to?
10. Why do you think there is a sundial in the church grounds?
